Art can lead to various careers...

Industrial Design which studies the production of products for both consumer and capital goods markets; Theatre Design; Silversmithing/Jewellery Design; Ceramics aimed at both studio and industrial products ; Furniture Design; Interior Design; Architecture; Fashion and Textile Design.

Art will encourage students to develop an interest in, enthusiasm for, and enjoyment of art, craft and design. It will also give them the experience of working with a broad range of media, including traditional and new media and technologies.

The course consists of technique workshops including; drawing, painting, print making, batik, ceramics and collage.

Students then explore an open ended theme by experimentation of media and techniques and artist research.

This work is displayed in a variety of ways including in sketchbooks and on mountboard with a view to classroom development of final piece(s) in at least 2 of the following endorsements (Fine Art, Textile Design, 3 Dimensional Design).

As well as pursuing the development of coursework, the student is expected to produce specific homework assignments and report

on a visit to local galleries accompanied by an illustrated evaluation of that visit.

Trips for students are a regular event. In the past three years, trips have included Paris and London.
