### Tomorrow's Teachers

This exciting programme was launched this term at St Julie's by Mike Ashton from Edge Hill University. The aim of the programme is to offer Year 13 students who might be considering a career in teaching the opportunity to engage in hands on observation and discussion of the various areas that make up a teacher's daily responsibilities.

This prestigious programme requires students to attend placements in a school, with support and input from our partner schools, along with sessions delivered by Edge Hill University. At the end of the programme there is the opportunity to spend a day at the Faculty of Education where they will receive an official Edge Hill certificate summarising their involvement and achievement; something that will be useful to them when applying to university and attending teacher training interviews.

In addition, students will have a mock interview organised by Edge Hill staff, tour of the Edge Hill Campus and Education Faculty plus bespoke advice on completing UCAS applications, personal statements and skills tests. There will also be the chance to gain general advice and guidance about the various routes into a career in teaching.

In September, an additional Year 12 cohort will be identified to futher strengthen the links St Julie's has with Edge Hill to ensure our prospective teachers progress to University with one foot on the Initial Teacher Training ladder.





With UCAS Apply 2015 now having gone live, students and their parents were invited to attend an information evening on Thursday 3rd July to help guide them through the application process. A wide range of support materials is available to students via the School VLE to assist with completing the application form, writing personal statements and much more.

This was followed by an information evening on Wednesday 9th July for parents of Year 11 applicants to Sixth Form to outline some of the key things that students can be doing to prepare for starting their A Level and Level 3 BTEC courses in September. All subject areas have made available 'Bridging Work' to be completed over the summer break as a means of helping students to familiarise themselves with the demands of their new courses.

On the same evening, parents of students in Years 10-12 were invited to attend a presentation by the Student Finance company, giving advice, guidance and reassurance about the process of applying for and repaying loans to cover university tuition fees.
