Summer 2016 delivered another set of fantastic results for our Sixth Form students, placing St Julie's Catholic Sixth Form once again amongst the top performing Sixth Forms locally and nationally.

We had positive value added scores for both A Level and Level 3 BTEC courses, meaning that students in Sixth Form at St Julie's, in both types of qualification, make better progress than students nationally with similar prior attainment.

Throughout the discussions, Miss Eagle fielded questions across a wide range of topics from local public transport to the Labour leadership contest and spoke with candour in response to all of them.


Thanks to Miss Eagle and her team for the insights and inspiration that she brought to our community.



Performing Arts in the Spotlight

Students and staff celebrated some amazing results this summer. 87.5% of students achieved A*-C grades and 56.3% of students achieved A*/A grades in Dance. In Drama, 86.4% of students achieved A*-C grades and 40.9% achieved A*/A grades.
