

# St. Julie's Record Results Beat National Trend!

**We are delighted to announce another fantastic year of exam results at St. Julie's Catholic High School, with improvements that defy the national trend!**

**We've had a hugely successful year in Sixth Form, with nearly three quarters of students achieving a grade C or above at A Level. The A\*-B pass rate has improved to 40.6%, the A\* to C pass rate has risen to 73.3% and the A\*-E pass rate is 99.6%, all of which are a reflection of the hard work, commitment and dedication from students and staff throughout the year.**

Students have gained a place at their first choice university which range from Durham to Warwick to Liverpool. Course choices range from Biochemistry, Fine Art, Law, French and Hispanic studies, Business management, Drama

and Theatre studies, Maths and Philosophy, to name but a few. 96% of students have accessed a course at university which is a fantastic achievement. We are also pleased to report that all students are in Employment, Education and/or Training, further evidence of the inclusiveness of our school.

Well done to all of our Sixth Form students and we wish them every success on their way to university, college or training.

Results at GCSE were equally exciting, and we celebrated our outstanding set of GCSE results with Juice FM as some of our brave students opened their results on-air! They needn't have worried, as our overall achievement for Year 11 students this year was a remarkable **70.1% A\* to C with English and Maths.**



We're also delighted to report that 100% of students achieved 5 A\* to G grades at GCSE. These outstanding achievements are a result of the commitment, hard work and excellent attitude shown by students, along with the tireless commitment of staff and the dedicated support of parents.
