
One of the big differences at Secondary School is that you move about a lot more, going to different rooms to see different teachers. To help you keep on track of exactly where you need to be, and when, you'll be given a timetable which is a table of helpful information for you to organise your day.

Here's what one looks like...

The day is split up into seven slots, called periods, and in these slots you have lessons. Almost all of your lessons are 50 minutes long. In this timetable, Megan has Science in Period 3 on Monday.



This is a special lesson that we call a 'double lesson'. This is because it's twice as long as all of your other lessons. That's because you're doing practical tasks like woodwork, textiles or cookery and they need a bit more time.

Why are there no lessons here? Because it's lunch time!

The important thing is not to worry if this seems a bit confusing. When you start, your Form Tutor will explain your timetable to you. If at any time during the week you're not quite sure what lesson you're supposed to be at you can show your timetable to any staff member that you see or any other student and they will be very happy to help you.
