#### Dear Parent/Carer,

#### Re: Year 11 (current)

I hope you and your family are safe and well. I am writing to inform you about the plans for September. Following national school closures on Monday 23 March we had to adapt very quickly to new ways of working. Over the last few months we have developed remote learning systems to support your daughter's education at home. May I take this opportunity to thank you for the wonderful work you have completed with your daughter during these very difficult times. We are aware that many families have faced great difficulties and trauma over the last few months and we will continue to support families moving forward.

### Well-being and Support

Over the last few months school has been extremely busy ensuring that social distancing and hygiene measures are in place for all students and staff. Alongside this, we have continued to maintain a thriving community which is reflected in the weekly newsletters <a href="www.stjulies.org.uk">www.stjulies.org.uk</a>. This captures a snapshot of the work which has taken place over the last few months to engage students in remote learning as well as take part in a range of activities.

If your daughter meets the entry requirements for Sixth Form and wishes to return in September, we want to reassure you that her well-being is of the utmost importance to us. It is essential that as a Catholic community your daughter has the opportunity to reflect on the last few months and for staff to support your daughter's individual needs. We fully appreciate that during this global pandemic, families may have faced great adversity and trauma. Through our transition programme we will ensure that each student can share their experiences and have access to appropriate support, if required. We will focus on the importance of kindness, friendship, respect and resilience.

## **Remote Learning**

Your daughter can continue to access pre-recorded videos via Educake, GCSEPod, MathsWatch, Oak National Academy and Pearson. Alongside this, staff have released some pre-recorded videos to support new topics or to explain key concepts.

Whilst the interactive features of the VLE offer a better experience we appreciate that online home learning may not always be possible. If you are having technical difficulties with access please email <a href="mailto:passwords@stjulies.org.uk">passwords@stjulies.org.uk</a>, but for those who are completely unable to access digital resources we ask parents to contact school <a href="mailto:reception@stjulies.org.uk">reception@stjulies.org.uk</a> and request paper copies of work which will then be posted home.

All Year 11 to 12 summer bridging work can be accessed via the VLE, MathsWatch and Educake. The deadline for your daughter to complete and return this will be Friday 4 September. If your daughter is accepted onto an A Level course (or equivalent), an assigned teacher will mark this work and provide feedback. We have advised students to only complete bridging work for the courses they are interested in studying from September. All coursing is subject to students meeting the Governors' Entry Requirements for Sixth Form.

A copy of your daughter's end of year report will be published home in July. This will include academic information from September 2019 to March 2020. Students will also be commended on any

work completed during national school closures. We will not be able to provide any operational grades because this may compromise the actual grades awarded on results day.

# **GCSE Results Day**

GCSE results day will take place on Thursday 20 August (10-12:00pm). Students will receive a print out of their grades awarded. Due to the exceptional circumstances regarding summer exams in 2020, staff will be on hand to answer any questions and support students with their next steps. Information was posted to all Year 11, 12 and 13 parents on 3 April, 20 April and 27 April. This outlined guidance on the exam grading process for Summer 2020. A copy of the Ofqual guidance <a href="www.gov.uk/ofqual">www.gov.uk/ofqual</a> 'Summer 2020 grades for GCSE and A Level – guidance for teachers, students and parents' was also provided for parents (copy enclosed). On page 4 of this document it states:

### How will centre assessment grades work?

We are asking schools and colleges to use their professional experience to make a fair and objective judgement of the grade they believe a student would have achieved had they sate their exams this year. It is important that schools and colleges take into account the full range of available evidence when they grade students – including non-exam assessment; the results of any homework assignments or mock exams; any other records of student performance over the course of study.

This information will allow Ofqual, with exam boards, to standardise grades across schools and colleges, to make sure that, as far as possible, results are fair and that students are not advantaged or disadvantaged because their schools or colleges are more generous or harsh than others when GCSE, AS and A level students in England are making those judgements. That means the final grade your daughter receives could be different from the one we submitted to the exam board.

An additional letter regarding GCSE Results Day will be sent out before the end of term to outline the plans and procedures for the day.

Due to social distancing measures and strict guidance from Public Health England, students are encouraged to attend school unaccompanied. On arrival, your daughter will be assigned to a designated area to receive her results. If she has met the Governors' entry requirements <a href="www.stjulies.org.uk">www.stjulies.org.uk</a> for Sixth Form she will be able to complete the application process on the day. For students who have not met the entry requirements, staff will be available to discuss your daughter's next steps. Unfortunately we cannot have large groups of people mixing on site therefore students will only be allowed on site for a maximum of thirty minutes. There will also be a queuing system to limit the amount of students on site at any one time.

#### **Autumn Exam Series**

An important feature of the overall arrangements this summer is the planned additional exam series in the autumn, which will provide an opportunity for students unable to receive a calculated grade, and others who would like the opportunity to improve their grade, to take an exam.

Due to the current uncertainty about when schools and colleges will re-open fully and the public health restrictions that may be in place, Ofqual are not consulting on the exact dates when the exams should take place. If possible, Ofqual envisage that AS and A level exams should take place in October and GCSE exams in November, with the exact timing to be confirmed, having taken advice from government, the exam boards and groups representing schools, colleges, teachers and students.

#### Assessment

To support your daughter's progress at St. Julie's, she will be provided with an A Level flightpath target from the start of Year 12 to the end of Year 13. Please refer to the Assessment section of the school website for further information. Baseline assessments will take place during September in most subject areas. This will provide an overview for staff to identify your daughter's strengths and areas for development.
