### **Re: Year 6 Transition Programme**

Over the last few weeks we have been in contact with 180 Year 6 students and their parents as part of St. Julie's Catholic High School's transition programme. It was great to learn so much about your daughter's strengths and qualities. Under the current circumstances we want to continue to ensure that your daughter's transition to secondary school is as smooth as possible. All teachers and parents are aware that the move from primary to secondary school can be quite a daunting experience for most children. We aim to ensure that the transition from Year 6 to Year 7 is a stress free and efficient process.

We have established excellent working relationships with all local feeder primary schools and our teachers regularly visit schools and assist in lessons, with pupils also visiting us here at St. Julie's Catholic High School to take part in numerous curriculum taster sessions, prior to national school closures.

### Well-being and Support

Over the last few months school has been extremely busy ensuring that social distancing and hygiene measures are in place for all students and staff. Alongside this, we have continued to maintain a thriving community which is reflected in the weekly newsletters <u>www.stjulies.org.uk</u>. This captures a snapshot of the work which has taken place over the last few months to engage students in remote learning as well as take part in a range of activities.

From September we want to reassure you that your daughter's well-being is of the utmost importance to us. It is essential that as a Catholic community your daughter has the opportunity to reflect on the last few months and for staff to support your daughter's individual needs. We fully appreciate that during this global pandemic, families may have faced great adversity and trauma. Through our transition programme we will ensure that each student can share their experiences and have access to appropriate support, if required. We will focus on the importance of kindness, friendship, respect and resilience.

### Curriculum

Over the last few months, our curriculum teams have reviewed and adjusted curriculum maps in preparation for the start of the new academic year. This will give students the opportunity to review, retrieve, reconnect and understand aspects of their Key Stage 2 curriculum and how this links with the Key Stage 3 curriculum. These adjustments will ensure that any gaps in knowledge and understanding are addressed quickly to support progress in the classroom. Alongside this, students will not be placed in any sets until we have a clearer understanding of individual needs. Standardised assessments will take place during September in English, Mathematics and Science. Students are not required to revise for these tests but they will provide an overview for staff to identify your daughter's strengths and areas for development.

A full curriculum overview for each department can be accessed via the school website <u>www.stjulies.org.uk</u>. This includes key information for each department which also includes prior

knowledge and how we build on skills from KS2 and enhance at KS3. A copy of the curriculum booklet for 2020/21 can also be viewed via the website.

During September (w/c 14/9/20), your daughter will complete GL assessments <u>www.gl-assessment.co.uk</u> in the following areas:

- English 70 minute test
- Mathematics 70 minute test
- Science 70 minute test
- Reading and Spelling 20-30minutes
- CAT testing (Cognitive Ability Tests) 3 part test (45minutes)

CAT4 is the UK's most widely used test of reasoning abilities for children aged 6 - 17 + years.

It is an assessment of developed abilities in areas known to make a difference to learning and achievement – namely verbal, non-verbal, quantitative and spatial reasoning – and it provides an objective perspective on potential student achievement.

Importantly, CAT4 also provides indicators for national tests and examinations, which will be particularly useful given the absence of national data this year. For schools in England, this includes retrospective Key Stage 2 indicators, as well as 9-1 GCSE and A level indicators.

Given schools have been closed for the majority of students for a number of months this year, CAT4 can provide valuable baselining and transition data as schools reopen, all with national benchmarks.

Each assessment will be completed digitally and will provide instant feedback for schools. This information will be used to support setting but most importantly identify your daughter's strengths and areas which may require additional support and/or gaps in learning. We will reassure your daughter that the assessments will be used to support her learning moving forward. **Please be assured that your daughter does not need to prepare or revise for any of the above tests.** 

#### Assessment

To support your daughter's progress at St. Julie's, we have developed a Knowledge Assessment Framework. This new framework is less data driven and more focused on your daughter's knowledge and understanding. A copy of this booklet can be found in the Assessment section of the school website. Your daughter will receive further guidance in September about the Knowledge Assessment Framework.

### Extra-curricular

From September, your daughter will receive an extra-curricular timetable for all curriculum areas. Extra-curricular clubs are available at lunchtimes and after-school. Approximately over 500 students take part in extra-curricular activities each week. We actively encourage students to take part in extra-curricular activities because it develops many skills in young people such as: leadership; teamwork; resilience; dedication; commitment and communication skills.

#### Other key information

Information regarding school uniform, behaviour for learning and general school rules was published in the previous transition pack. All information can also be accessed via the school website.

# September

In September your daughter will begin her education at St. Julie's Catholic High School in a mixed ability tutor group. She will remain in this tutor group for five years. This system allows the form tutor to build up a detailed knowledge of your child and also provides you with a clearly identified point of contact if you have any concerns, ensuring the continuity and stability we think is so vital for success.

During September, your daughter will remain in a mixed ability group during lessons. However, once the baseline assessments have been completed, your daughter will be moved into sets from the end of September. Due to Covid-19 and the cancellation of SATS we do not have sufficient data to place your daughter into an appropriate set at the start of term and we want to ensure that any decisions made regarding setting are made fairly and equitably.
