What is a wider reading list?

Even though you have timetabled lessons where you take notes and complete classwork, this doesn't mean you don't have to research your subject. A wider reading list is an important inventory of supplementary reading titles that your course teacher, as a subject specialist, has put together, that will not only aid your understanding of your course – it will boost your final grade.

How can a wider reading list boost my grade?

Provided you make full and thorough use of the reading list and read around your subject, your knowledge of the course content will not be as narrow as if you extend your understanding with research of your own. As a result, your confidence increases as you will naturally know more. It is obvious to teachers which students are undertaking wider research and which students aren't. Provided you reference the titles you're alluding to, you can also cite theories and ideas of experts in your own work – which showcases your research. This is a very important skill for university.

It is a long list. Do I have to read all of the titles to stand the chance of a good grade?

No. There are thousands of books out there, so it is unrealistic to expect to read them all. A wider reading list is a targetted yet shortened group of titles that your teacher feels will benefit you the most. Even by reading two or three books / articles, your subject knowledge will increase dramatically.

What if I ignore the list altogether?

If you ignore the reading list altogether, you will be relying purely on the notes you take during lessons. The outcome of this is that you Hopefully you will be making regular trips to the library to do your own research and as long as it is fruitful then you should be in for a decent grade.

Why do wider reading lists exist in the first place?

Your teacher has spent quite a while putting it together so it can't have been simply to make your life harder and make you miss out on a social life. The wider reading list fits the specification of your course. As you enter the library you will be faced with tens, even hundreds of thousands of books – each one painstakingly catalogued according to subject area, theme, topic, title, author. Before sifting through this maze of a fire hazard, spare a thought for your reading list being exactly the information you need – curated well before you joined the course by your long suffering teacher.

What will you gain from the wider reading list?

You will instantly be prepared for applying wider knowledge to your work. After having read the material and applied it to your notes, all you will need to do is format an answer for each essay. The content will spill from your fingertips as you will confidently regurgitate all the information you need. You will also need to reference each quote in footnotes or in a bibliography; your tutor will see that you've read the wider reading list and will think very positively about you. In fact, if you've shown that you've read the list and still do not manage to score highly, your tutor should be impressed enough with your effort that you deserve some extra help and attention. This will pave the way for higher grades and future success!

Wider reading develops you as an independent learner. It deepens your understanding of a subject and makes you more attractive to universities. As an A Level Student you should allocate some of your independent study time to wider reading; 15-45 minutes of sustained silent reading or active purposeful reading each day is an effective use of your independent study time and will build learning power.

One of the best ways you stand out during your Sixth Form studies is through the amount of independent study you undertake outside of the classroom. The ability to extend yourself and research independently into your interests is an invaluable skill – this will support your university applications and/or future job applications and interviews.

All universities expect more than just classroom knowledge, and hence engaging in academic enrichment tasks that show you are interested in your studies beyond what is on the school syllabus is, in essence, a super-curricular activity.

The list of books, journals, magazines and websites in this booklet is by no means exhaustive or definitive – instead they are examples to help you develop your interests not only in your chosen fields of study, but also in the wider world around you.
