



Keeping Children Safe



There is always someone to go to in school for help. You may have experienced something unpleasant outside school, be concerned about someone else's welfare, or just need some help or advice.

If you have concerns about yourself or someone else, the adults in school will:

- Listen to you and note carefully what you tell us.
- Will not make judgements or assumptions about you or a friend.
- Tell someone in school who is most able to help you.
- Provide advice and reassurance to you or a friend.
- Work hard to help you and sort things out.
- Support you in a variety of ways.

To raise a concern and seek help and advice you can:

- Speak to your Form Tutor, Progress Leader, any adult in school you trust, PC Dawn or your parents.
- Let us know using the form on the website, the suggestion box, SHARP system on the website, or a note to a trusted adult.
- Speak to your family and ask them to come in with you to speak to us.
- Trust all members of staff to listen to you and act on what you tell us.
