

Careers Information Advice and Guidance Programme 2020-21 (Careers Strategy Programme)

Good career guidance is critical if young people are to raise their aspirations and capitalise on the opportunities available to them. The Gatsby benchmarks define world-class career guidance and were developed on behalf of Gatsby by Sir John Holman as part of an international study.

Every young person needs high-quality career guidance to make informed decisions about their future. Good career guidance is a necessity for delivering technical education reforms and is a vehicle for social justice.

The Good Career Guidance Report identifies a set of eight benchmarks that schools can use as a framework for improving their careers provision. **The eight Gatsby benchmarks of Good Career Guidance:**

1. A stable careers programme
2. Learning from career and labour market information
3. Addressing the needs of each pupil
4. Linking curriculum learning to careers
5. Encounters with employers and employees
6. Experiences of workplaces
7. Encounters with further and higher education
8. Personal guidance
