Re: Year 11 GCSE Results Day

I am writing to inform you of the arrangements for GCSE Results Day, due to take place on **Thursday 25th August 2022 (9:00am – 11:00am)**. Students must attend unaccompanied unless a parent/carer makes a pre-arranged meeting with an assigned member of staff. Staff will be on hand to answer any questions and support students with their next steps.

Plans for Results Day

On arrival, your daughter will be assigned to a designated area to receive her results. If she has met the Governors' entry requirements www.stjulies.org.uk for Sixth Form she will be able to finalise the application process on the day. For students who have not met the entry requirements, staff will be available to discuss your daughter's next steps. Students will be invited on site and a register taken during an allocated slot for her form group as follows:

Summer Bridging Work

All Year 11 to 12 summer bridging work can be accessed via the VLE, MathsWatch and Educake. The deadline for your daughter to complete and return this will be Monday 5 September. If your daughter is accepted onto an A Level course (or equivalent), an assigned teacher will mark this work and provide feedback. We have advised students to only complete bridging work for the courses they are interested in studying from September. Students can collect paper copies of the bridging work on results day. **All coursing is subject to students meeting the Governors' Entry Requirements for Sixth Form.**

Programme of Study	Entry requirements
X4 A Levels/Level 3 Applied General + Core RE + Enrichment + 1 week work experience (Extended Project Qualification will be optional)	Minimum of 5 x 9 – 5 GCSE; average grade of at least 5 or above across all subjects; minimum Grade 5 in English and Mathematics
X3 A Levels/Level 3 Applied General + Core RE + Enrichment + 1 week work experience	Minimum of 5 x 9 – 4 GCSE; average grade of Grade 4 or above across all subjects
X2 A Level/L3 Applied General courses and weekly work experience pathway (only for students not considering university)	GCSE performance meets subject specific entry criteria for subjects being taken (minimum Grade 4 or above in specified subjects)

Students not intending to enrol at St Julie's Catholic Sixth Form must complete a **Destination Form** and return this to staff.
