Attendance

The attendance target for all students is 100%. Extensive research has been carried out on attendance and the direct correlation it has with attainment. Analysis of the performance of St Julie's students at GCSE shows that there is a very clear link between attendance and academic attainment, with the students who are never or rarely absent from school significantly outperforming those who are late on a more frequent basis. Students with 98% attendance typically achieve twice as many Grades 9-5 and Grades 9-7 as students with below 90% attendance.

Punctuality:

We expect students to be on time for school and lessons every day. The school day begins at **08:45** and students arriving after this time will receive a late mark. School opens for all students from 8:00am with a hot or cold breakfast available in the dining room.

All students engage in daily form time reading and analysis of reading age scores shows that students who arrive late, and miss out on this reading time, have significantly lower reading ages than those students who arrive on time. There is a clear correlation between higher reading age and stronger academic performance and students who arrive late are therefore jeopardising their chances of success.

With this in mind and in order to improve academic achievement it is vital that your daughter attends all lessons and for the full duration of the lesson. In order to improve this, we have reviewed all exit passes. If your daughter requires a toilet or lift pass medical evidence must be provided. If you believe your daughter has a need for either of these passes, please send the medical evidence to her progress leader via the email addresses provided.

Uniform

It is also important that your daughter attends school in the correct uniform. This sets her up for the day and promotes a good work ethic. When purchasing and sorting uniform for the next academic year:

- Jewellery is not permitted. If your daughter wants her ears/nose pierced, it is probably best to do it at the start of the summer holidays and the piercings must then be removed by the time she returns to school. Students are not permitted to wear any piercings in school. Rings, necklaces, bracelets and other such items must not be worn in school. This is non-negotiable and part of the uniform policy and students will be required to remove any such items. School cannot take any responsibility should students lose any such items.
- Shoes must be flat soled, black, leather and polishable with a closed toe. Your daughter cannot wear trainers of any kind, canvas shoes, plastic shoes, such as Melissa's, or shoes with accessories on them, such as bows.
- Hair must be always tied back.
- Hair colour must be natural.
- False nails, acrylic nails, shellac, gel nails and nail polish are not allowed in school. It must be removed before returning to school on 4th September.
- Students cannot wear make-up or false tan to school.
- If a student is wearing a coat to school, it must be **plain black or navy**. We do not allow fur in school, real or fake.
- Mobile phones rules have been expanded to include all connected devices such as Air pods and Smartwatches and apply from 8.30am onwards. Air pods and phones will be confiscated if seen or heard. Smartwatches will be confiscated if suspected of being used for communication purposes.

Any issues relating to uniform and connected devices will be addressed under the school's Behaviour for Learning Policy, to which all parents and students agree to adhere when they enrol at St Julie's as part of the home-school agreement.

During the summer holidays email accounts may not be monitored daily. Urgent concerns during non-working hours must go through our website www.stjulies.org.uk feedback form, accessed via the bottom right section on the main page or via email to safeguarding@stjulies.org.uk.

Following our most recent OFSTED inspection (May 2023) which highlighted the excellent standards and expectations at St. Julie's Catholic High School. We will continue to build on this and move forward. Inspectors stated, 'Leaders expect students to follow the principles of the school's founder, which encompass respect, friendship, enjoyment and compassion. Students rise to leader's high expectations. They value the emphasis that leaders place on social and cultural learning alongside academic achievement. This helps them to develop into confident young citizens.'
